On 27 June 2019, UGC vide letter F.No. 74-4/2018 (DEB-I) approved, recognized 7 of its courses (BA, MBA, MCA, BBA, BCA, BSc (IT) and MSc (IT)) on the basis of applications received under UGC (ODL) Regulations 2017 (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Amendment) to offer ODL mode.

Regulations 2017, and dismissed the Writ Petition filed by the University. Accordingly, in view of the judgment, the University is presently unable to conduct any examinations outside the State of Sikkim and started conducting examinations in Sikkim.

University had filed Writ Appeal under Rule 148 of the Sikkim High Court (Practice and Procedure) Rules 2011, aggrieved by the Impugned Judgment dated 03.01.2020 passed by the Hon'ble Single Judge in W.P. Civil No. 65 of 2016. It has been accepted by Hon'ble Sikkim the High Court and awaiting the listing of the same.

It has come to the notice of the University that; a disabled student had filed Interim

Application praying for an ad ex parte stay of the operation of the Impugned Judgment 03.01.2020 dated passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Sikkim in Writ Petition (Civil) No.65 of 2016. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its order dated 08.04.2021 had moved this to Guwahati Hight Court. The matter has been heard on 14.03.2022 8 14.03.2022. The matter is listed for hearing on 25.04.2022.

O2. Based on Original Application (OA) No. 113/2017 filed by Mr Rakesh Shukla to the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Bangalore Bench, Bangalore.

The Hon'ble Tribunal declared that the degrees conferred by SMU in Bachelor of Science (Multimedia) ['B.Sc.(MM)'], through Open and Distance Learning ['ODL'] mode, was non-est in the eyes of law and had no academic value. More egregiously, the Hon'ble Tribunal has altogether doubted the integrity and methodology of distance education systems and proceeded to impose punitive costs to the tune of Rs.

University had appealed against the orders in Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka under WP 39573/2018. The preliminary hearing happened on 13.08.19 and November 2019. University received show cause notice on 08.12.2019 and Vakalatnama was executed and filed in Registry of the High

25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakhs Only) and Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Only) in favour of Karnataka State Legal Service Authority ['KSLSA'] and Mr Rakesh Kumar Shukla, respectively.

Court of Karnataka on 20.12.2019. The captioned matter was listed for hearing on 24.02.2021,15.04.2021 16.09.2021. The matter is now listed for final hearing, it may take a while before the matters are listed again. This is owing to the volume of matters that the Courts have pending in backlog for final hearing, including certain matters that are older in time.

# WP No. 34/2019: Withdrawing of UGC O3. Approval for Distance Education Programs for the Academic Year 2019-2020:

University had filed IA in Hon'ble Court, seeking a stay of the decisions / communications of the UGC by which the approval granted to SMU to offer certain ODL programs in the academic year 2019-20 was withheld and placed in abeyance. Also sought permission to admit / re-admit students to the said ODL programs.

This was listed before Hon'ble Court on 16.9.2019 and said application was listed for hearing on 20.11.2019. The UGC local counsel sought time citing he does not have any direction from UGC in this regard. This case was listed before the High Court 21.02.2020 and 20.06.2020 where our local counsel

represented. The respondents have been granted six weeks to file their counters and two weeks thereafter for the petitioners to rejoinder. The rejoinder to UGC counter was filed on 7th September the and case posted for hearing on 30.11.2020. The UGC writ was listed in November and was heard on 25.05.2021. The final **hearing** is listed on 25.04.2022



# GRANT OF DR. RAMDAS M. PAI SCHOLARSHIP (100% COURSE FEE WAIVER) TO DESERVING MERITORIOUS STUDENTS WHO HAVE UNFORTUNATELY LOST THEIR SOLE (FATHER OR MOTHER) EARNING PARENT DURING THEIR COURSE OF STUDY AT SMU AND ITS CONSTITUENTS

1. <u>Authority:</u> Mr Nishith K Mohanty, Group President (HR & Academia) vide email dated 08 September 2021 on the captioned subject.

#### 2. Preamble:

On the occasion of the 86<sup>th</sup> Birthday of Dr. Ramdas Pai, scholarship scheme has been announced for deserving meritorious students who have unfortunately lost their sole earning member (father or mother) of the family, during their course of study at the Group's Universities (MAHE, MUJ and SMU). The scholarship is in the form of course fee waiver for the remaining duration of the study at the Universities.

#### 3. Scholarship Amount:

Scholarship will be in the form of complete course fee waiver, which is 100% of course fee. The scholarship is limited ONLY to course fees and is <u>NOT</u> applicable for any other fees (casual / re-registration / hostel / examination fees etc).

#### 4. Eligibility/Guidelines:

- (a) Applicable only to the students who have unfortunately lost their sole earning member (father or mother) of the family during the <u>course of study</u> at any of the Constituent Units of SMU.
- (b) The scholarship will be applicable for the meritorious <u>regular</u> students on rolls without failures (F) / detention (DT) grades who are studying in any of the Constituent Units of SMU



- (c) The cut-off month: The scheme is applicable with prospective waiver of course fee only from the date of announcement (17.09.2021) and will not include prior period.
- (d) The scholarship will be applicable for the remaining duration of study (of the particular course/ programme) and will be applicable for all categories of eligible students (including General, Sikkimese, Foreign/ NRI).
- (e) This scholarship will be applicable to all programs (excluding online programs, certificate courses, and fellowships) including students who receive stipend from SMU.
- (f) There will be NO refund of the fee already paid.
- (g) In case of NRI sponsored students, if the sponsor (other than parents) expires, then such students are <u>NOT</u> eligible to receive the scholarship.
- (h) If the student is already receiving any other scholarship (including benevolent fund) offered by SMU then such scholarship will be withdrawn.

#### 5. For continuation of scholarship in the subsequent years:

- The student should <u>not</u> have failure (F) / detention (DT) grades in the present & previous academic years.
- The student should <u>not</u> have been involved in the instance/ incident of proven charge of indiscipline, bringing disrepute to the department / institution / university. In such case, a duly constituted committee will examine the facts and submit recommendations for approval of Hol and ratification by VC.

#### 6. Documents Required:

The eligible students have to submit the applications along with the necessary documents mentioned below to the respective Heads of Institutes/ Units:

- a) Death certificate of the parent issued by the competent government authority.
- b) Previous Three years IT returns of the deceased parent(s).
- c) If the living parent is not earning, Notarized Affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.50/- (please refer Annexure) stating that living parent (with AADHAR & PAN number) is not working/earning and has not filed IT returns for three years.





- If AADHAR and/ or PAN card are not available, the same shall be duly specified in the Affidavit (refer Annexure).
- 7. Based on documents mentioned in para 5 (a) (c) and other eligibility criteria, the Committee constituted vide SMU Convening Order No. 058/SMU/REG/CO/93/2021 dated 10 Sep 2021, recommended the students (in para 7) of Sikkim Manipal University & its constituent units are found eligible for the grant of Dr. Ramdas M. 
